The most authentic source of Mauryan history is the epigraphical evidence. The edicts of Ashoka are the oldest the best preserved and the most precisely dated epigraphic records of India. The inscriptions were engraved on rocks, boulders, cave walls and pillars of stone. The inscriptions of Ashoka are of two kinds. The smaller group consists of declaration of the King as a lay

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Buddhist. These describe his own acceptance of Buddhism and his relationship with the *sankha*. The second group of important inscriptions consist of major and minor rock edicts and pillar edicts. They describe his famous policy of *Dhamma*. These inscriptions were installed in prominent places either near towns or on important trade and travel routes or in the proximity of religious centres and places of religious importance. A series of 14 major rock edicts of Ashoka inscribed on large boulders were discovered from the places like Girnar, Kalsi, Maski, Yeragundi, Manschra, Sopara etc.

Babar and Humayun allowed the land revenue system of the sultanate period to remain in existence and generally collected revenue on the basis of the old records without surveying the land and ascertaining the actual produce of the soil. Akbar was the founder of the Mughal revenue system, which he evolved through experiments and that continued till 1585. In the beginning he adopted Sher Shah's system in which the cultivated area was measured and a crop rate was drawn up fixing the dues of the peasant crop -wise on the productivity of land. The state's share was one third of the produce. This schedule was converted every year into a central schedule of prices. But it was soon found that the fixing of Central schedule of prices often led to the considerable delays and resulted in great hardships to the peasantry. Since the prices fixed were generally those prevailing at the imperial court, and thus were higher than in the countryside, the peasants had to part with a large share of their produce.

The English East India Company, for the first time through the Charter act of 1813 adopted a provision to spend one lakh rupees per annum "for the revival and promotion of literature and the encouragement of the learned native of India and for the introduction and promotion of knowledge of the sciences among the inhabitants of the British territories." This act was the first legislative recognition of the right for education. Its importance lay in the fact that the company at least assumed its responsibilities for the first time in the field of education. However the East India company allotted One lakh of rupees not for mass education but for learning of Sanskrit, Arabic and Persian because in the judicial department Indians conversant with Sanskrit, Persian and Arabic were required to work as assessors with British judges. Thus the real motive of the British was not philanthropic rather it was an administrative necessity. The company needed people to work as clerks.
